



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health plan. The SBC shows you how you and the plan would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this plan (called the premium) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why this Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u>?	\$0 individual/ \$0 family network. \$400 individual/ \$800 family out-of-network.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u>?	No.	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply.
Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	Network deductible does not apply to office visits, preventive care services, emergency room services, urgent care, outpatient mental health, outpatient substance use disorder, and rehabilitation services. Copayments don't count toward the network deductible .	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services, but see the chart starting on page 2 for other cost for services of this plan.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u>?	Network: \$0 individual/ \$0 family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> . Out-of-network: \$1,500 individual/ \$3,000 family out-of-network.	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

If you don't have Minimum Essential Coverage for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.
